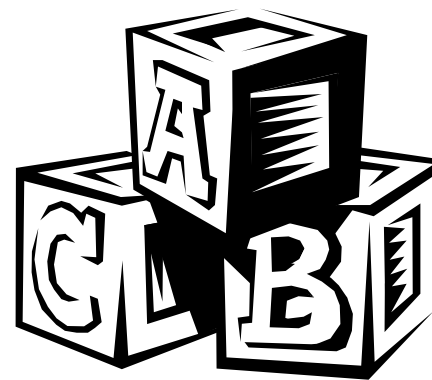

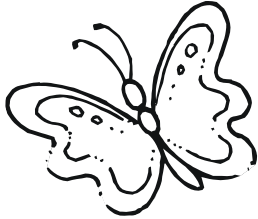

Research Tells Us Why Quality Child Care Matters

- ✓ Quality early childhood care and education can produce large effects on IQ during the early childhood years and sizable persistent effects on school achievement, grade retention, special education, high school graduation, and socialization.
- ✓ Across a wide range of child care settings, quality child care (as defined by positive caregiving and language stimulation given in the child care environment), positively influences a child's early cognitive and language development.
- ✓ Children in high quality child care display more advanced language and pre-math skills, better relationships with their caregiver, and more advanced pro-social skills than those in low quality settings.



What is a High Quality Child Care Environment?

In a high quality child care environment, children are:

- ⇒ Respected, valued and nurtured as individuals
- ⇒ Encouraged to problem solve, take responsibility and learn social skills
- ⇒ Well nourished, properly rested, healthy, and safe
- ⇒ Participate in age appropriate activities

In a high quality child care environment, parents are:

- ⇒ Recognized and encouraged as active partners in the “shared caring” relationship with the child care program
- ⇒ Provided with the necessary support and information to enhance confidence in their parenting skills and their personal sense of self-esteem

SCRATCH AND SNIFF WATERCOLORS

With these watercolors you can paint pictures of oranges that smell like oranges, grapes that smell like grapes, and cherries that smell like cherries.

What you will need:

- ✓ 1 Tablespoon unsweetened powdered drink mix.
- ✓ 1 Tablespoon warm water.
- ✓ Several small containers (muffin tins work well).

½ cup non-fat dry milk
1 tablespoon honey

Mixing bowl
Mixing spoon or fork
Wax paper (optional)

Directions:

1. Combine cream cheese, milk, and honey in a bowl. Mix until well-blended.
2. Mold sculptures on wax paper, crackers or bread.
3. Eat!

Tips:

Store unused portions in an airtight container and refrigerate. Use the expiration date on the package of cream cheese as a guide for storage length.

Pasta and Meat- Activity

Items Needed:

- ✓ Large colander/pasta strainer with handles
- ✓ Laundry basket
- ✓ Ping-pong balls or paper balls (crumpled up pieces of paper)

What to do:

Put children in groups of two. Designate one child as the meat tosser and the other child as the catcher. The meat tosser (place all balls in a laundry basket or other holding device) will throw the meat (ping-pong balls or crumpled paper) one at a time and the catcher runs to catch each ball in their strainer. If the children want, after all the balls have been thrown, they can switch roles.

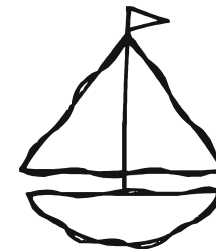
