Getting dressed in the morning is something that kids need to get used to: we put on our shirts, pants, skirts, and whatever else we choose to be fitting for the weather outside. A great way to help your child better learn the different articles of clothing is by naming the articles of clothes as you pick them out for the day and as you help them get dressed.



Arts & Crafts

Materials: Magazines, scissors, construction paper, and glue.
Description: First divide the paper into as many sections as you like according to articles of clothing. For example, you can have a shirt section, pant section, etc. Next, browse through the magazine with your child and help them cut out all of the shirts and place them in the shirt box and so on and so forth according to the different sections you made in the beginning. Have fun!
