Easter is a great time to teach about new beginnings. Incorporate your own religious beliefs or values as you teach your child about this holiday. You can also address topics such as Spring, growth, baby animals, and flowers. Share your traditions with your child, and enjoy this time of new beginnings together!



Arts & Crafts

Materials: Paper, brads, crayons, scissors

Cut two pieces of paper into identical egg shapes. Let your child decorate one of the egg shapes like an Easter egg, and let them draw a picture of what's inside on the other egg (i.e. a chick). Place the eggs together and insert a brad at the top. The egg should swing open to reveal its contents!

Snack Time

If you chose to fill plastic Easter eggs with treats of some kind, enjoy those for a snack. You could also make deviled eggs and eat those together. There are many fun Easter snacks—remember to enjoy candy and other sweets in moderation, but they can be a fun addition to Easter activities.



Activity & Games

Go on an Easter egg hunt. Hide plastic eggs filled with surprises in developmentally appropriate locations, inside or outside, and allow your child to find them.
